Access Advisory Committee..... Resident of the City or full-time employee of an entity doing business within the City and who represents the Disability Community.	1
Airport Commission..... Qualified electors ¹ of the City or residents of the County of Santa Barbara.	2
Architectural Board of Review Qualified electors ¹ of the City: One licensed landscape architect practicing in the City of Santa Barbara; one appointee with professional qualifications in related fields including, but not limited to, building design, structural engineering or industrial design; and one appointee who may be one of the above or a licensed architect, or who represents the public at large.	3*
<p>*Note: If Measure E passes, the number of vacancies will be reduced from 3 to 1. The appointee shall possess professional qualifications in related fields including, but not limited to, landscape architecture, building design, structural engineering and may be a voter of the County of Santa Barbara who is not a resident of the City.</p>	
Arts Advisory Committee..... One qualified elector ¹ of the City and three residents of the south coast area of Santa Barbara County.	4
Central Coast Commission for Senior Citizens Resident of the City.	1
Civil Service Commission..... Qualified elector ¹ of the City.	1

Community Development & Human Services Committee 6
 Residents or employees within the City; one representative from each:
 African American Community; Business Community/Economic
 Development; Downtown Neighborhood; Housing Interests; Human
 Services Agency and Senior Community.

Creeks Advisory Committee 1
 Resident of the City or the County of Santa Barbara with experience in
 ocean use, business, environmental issues, and/or provide community-at-
 large representation.

Downtown Parking Committee 2
 Residents of the City or the County of Santa Barbara

Fire and Police Commission..... 2
 Qualified electors¹ of the City.

Fire and Police Pension Commission..... 3
 One qualified elector¹ of the City who is not an active firefighter or police
 officer for the City of Santa Barbara; one active or retired firefighter who
 need not be a resident or qualified elector¹ of the City; and one active or
 retired police officer who need not be a resident or qualified elector¹ of the
 City.

Franklin Center Advisory Committee..... 3
 One resident or employee in the Franklin Neighborhood (Census Tract
 Nos. 8.01, 8.02 and 9; and two residents of the City who represent the public
 at large.

Harbor Commission..... 3*
 Two appointees must be qualified electors¹ of the City; and one may be a
 qualified elector of the City or a registered voter of the County of Santa
 Barbara.

*Note: If Measure D passes, the number of vacancies will be increased
 from 1 to 3 and one of the appointees may be a voter of the County of
 Santa Barbara who is not a resident of the City.

Historic Landmarks Commission..... 2
 One appointee must be a qualified elector¹ of the City and one appointee
 may be a resident of the County of Santa Barbara: Licensed architects,
 licensed landscape architects, professional architectural historians, or may
 represent the public at large.

Housing Authority Commission 1
 Senior tenant (62 years of age or older) who is receiving housing
 assistance from the Housing Authority of the City of Santa Barbara.

Library Board.....	1
Qualified elector ¹ of the City.	
Living Wage Advisory Committee	4
One member nominated by a local living wage advocacy organization; and One representative from each: Non-Profit Entity, Owner/Manager of a business operating within the City, Santa Barbara Chamber of Commerce.	
Lower Westside Center Advisory Committee	2
Residents of the City who represent the public at large.	
Measure P Committee.....	5
One civil liberties advocate; one criminal defense attorney; one medical marijuana patient; one medical professional; and one resident of the City.	
Park and Recreation Commission.....	3*
Qualified electors ¹ of the City who will serve on both the Park Commission and the Recreation Commission; one appointee may be a resident of the City who is 16 years of age or older.	
* <u>Note</u> : If Measure C passes, the number of vacancies will be increased from 1 to 3 and one of the appointees may be a youth representative, as provided by the ordinance of the City Council	
Planning Commission.....	2
Qualified electors ¹ of the City.	
Rental Housing Mediation Task Force	4
Two appointees must be residents of the City; non-City residents must be owners of residential rental property or affiliated with organizations concerned with landlord-tenant issues within the City limits: One homeowner; two landlords; and one tenant.	
Westside Center Advisory Committee.....	3
One resident or employee in the Westside Neighborhood (Census Tract 9, 10, 11.01 or 11.02); and two residents of the City who represent the public at large.
