**MAYOR'S TRIP TO WASHINGTON, D.C.**

I indicated at the Commission's last meeting that I would report any results or information originating from the Mayor's trip to Washington, D.C. I have attached a thorough report prepared by the City's Lobbyist, R.J. Lyerly, Firm of Carpi, Clay and Smith. I believe this updates the Commission both on dredge issues and other projects important to the City. I will summarize at the meeting.

**CA STATE BUDGET PROPOSALS – "ENTERPRISE ZONES"**

At last month's meeting Commissioner Friedman asked about possible impacts of the Governor's Budget proposal and specially the elimination of enterprise funds. A closer look and research shows that the Budget proposal is to eliminate "enterprise zones". These are different than enterprise funds, such as our Waterfront Department. I believe that this proposal will have no affect on the Waterfront Department.
