

Proposal to rename the West Side Community Center after

MR. LOUIS URZUA



Santa Barbara residents take pride in their city and express a desire for it to be safe and accessible to all residents. Part of Santa Barbara's charm and uniqueness is in its ability to pay homage to its history, while embracing and applying innovation. It can be argued that the city's events like Old Spanish Days, holiday parades, and cultural festivals are successes because they provide positive opportunities for residents to unite and enjoy shared experiences. Unity and mutual understanding are the key ingredients to a healthy community, and also the antidotes to community ills, as gang activity.


Gang activity is a national problem from which Santa Barbara has not been immune. The community-at-large is affected by gang activity directly in the form of robbery and physical assault, and indirectly as news headlines frequently report youth gang violence and the city's efforts to address it.

As the city diligently works towards creating policies and programs to concentrate on reactive and proactive gang interventions, residents have identified renaming the Westside Community Center as one way to take a stand against the polarizing nomenclature that gangs thrive off of while simultaneously paying homage to the memory of spirit of Louis Urzua, a local man who passionately promoted the education and empowerment of young people, especially youth from ethnic minority backgrounds.

Louis Urzua (1927-1991) established himself as a primary agent in supporting the positive development of young people in Santa Barbara. His passionate dedication to youth was likely shaped by his experiences as a young person;

having attended segregated schools in Carpinteria and then going to war in the 1940's, Urzua's life as a veteran was dedicated to seeking solutions to inequality and supporting the education and dignity of young people.


In the 1960's he helped form the non-profit community center, La Casa de la Raza, which continues to be a resource center for young people and their families. His dynamic legacy also includes time spent as a counselor at local schools, where he was known to never keep an office, because he saw a need to reach young people where they were



at, whether that be in the hallways, streets, or their homes. Prior to his death in 1991, local news highlighted his tireless efforts to support Santa Barbara's youth. He was credited with supporting the positive development of "impressionable [young people]" by "doing whatever it [took] to make sure they [were] educated." His methods were considered nonconventional by many, but what was clear in the work he did, was that he understood if the community needed youth to view themselves differently, the adults in their lives needed to view them differently first. Given the pervasiveness of youth gang violence in the Santa Barbara community, it appears that paradigm shift is still in need, today.

The city of Santa Barbara established the neighborhood community centers to house programming and events that improve the quality of life of those in need, including youth and their families. The Westside Community Center, located on Victoria St. and Castillo St., is in an area of the city that is in great need. As we all can attest that area's crime rate has increased over the years. Unfortunately, a building with the name "westside" offers itself up to be a polarizing agent and attracts negative attention.

The spirit of Louis Urzua was one of non-conventional, passionate efforts to support young people. The same students he worked to serve during the



1960's through 1990's, are the same students who continue to be in need today. Renaming the center to acknowledge

Urzua's legacy will facilitate change by eliminating the use of polarizing nomenclature, and by bringing attention to Urzua's approach to empowering young people with education and self-respect so that they can be an asset to themselves and to their community.

La Casa founder Luis Urzua dies

Luis Urzua, a founder of La Casa de la Raza, died Friday at his home in Santa Barbara, a month after a scholarship was established in his honor. He was 64 years old.

Urzua was born in Santa Barbara May 23, 1927. He was employed as a construction worker and retired from the Plasterers and Cement Mason Local No. 341. He retired less than two years ago from a 15-year job as a liaison for La Cumbre Junior High School and San Marcos High School, encouraging a generation of children to stay in school.

Much of Urzua's life was dedicated to making the Latino community a political and social force in Santa Barbara. He was one of the original founders of La Casa de la Raza, a Latino community cen-

ter in Santa Barbara, in 1970. During the same period, he founded Campo Aztlan, the first Latino youth camp in Santa Barbara, and the Chicano Community Action Committee. He was a member of the Brown Berets.

In January 1990, Urzua was suspended from his job as a community liaison at San Marcos High for organizing a rally of more than 200 students to protest public remarks by principal Bob Ferguson referring to gangs.

Urzua led the protesters in demanding an apology from Ferguson, saying the principal's comments cast all Latinos as gang members. Ferguson replied that he had been misquoted, and that social groups, not gangs, existed at the school. Urzua was reinstated after four days.

On Dec. 14, 200 supporters gathered at La Casa to honor Urzua with a scholarship in his name.

The scholarship will be awarded to a Latino high school senior. The Esperanza Foundation, a group that promotes community service.

Urzua's friends Friday recall a man with a big heart who

Louie Urzua: Fighting the War at Home

Sitting in the living room of his modest Santa Barbara home, Louie Urzua is in sharp contrast to his serene setting. For standing up for what he believes in and expressing himself in no uncertain terms, Urzua will be honored on December 14th at La Casa de la Raza with a scholarship fund set up in his name. Urzua is a refreshing, albeit abrasive and controversial anomaly in Santa Barbara. Fairly Chicano, Urzua is well known in the Mexican and Chicano community, as an inspiration and a tough, loving father figure. Outside of those communities, he has been seen as a rabble-rouser. Although some might perceive him as a troublemaker, he will plead guilty only to having a genuine concern for young, impressionable Chicano youths, and to doing whatever it takes to make sure they are educated. Anti-for him, education entails more than the three Rs; it involves the

teaching of pride in one's culture and oneself.

Born in 1927 in a very different Santa Barbara, Urzua attended a segregated school in Carpinteria during the 1930s, went abroad to war in the '40s, and began agitating for change—going to war here at home—in the '60s. Urzua is angry, plain and simple. He believes that people of color, those who make up the non-dominant culture in the United States, have grown increasingly complacent, that is, numb to what is happening to them. He believes properly directed anger arouses action, a move toward change that is most urgently needed today. So Urzua's mission has been to speak the truth to young kids who are inebriated by their feelings of vitality and invulnerability—forcing them to realize that without an education they will become the stereotypes that some people associate with various ethnic groups.

Urzua has been especially

effective at getting the word out, forcing parents, teachers and students to listen to the things they do not want to hear. Over the years he has seen the pride of people diminish, displaced by what the dominant culture deems acceptable and valuable. Although he was a counselor at La Gumbre Junior-High School for more than a decade, at San Marcos High School for a short spell, and a lecturer at various other places in and out of Santa Barbara, he recalls that he never had an office, nor did he need one. For him, the work that needs to be done is in the hallways, on the streets, and in the homes of Chicano kids in need of guidance. His message to them: pride, and identity within one's rich and viable culture.

In spite of the fact that he sees many obstacles set up by our society that hinder acceptance of diversity, he also recognizes that the best place for children to learn a sense of

value and self-worth is in the home. Unfortunately, these days many parents do not take the time to sit down with their kids, or according to Urzua, "They want more dollars than kids." This is not a monolithic deficiency, but one prevalent

enough to create many of the problems in today's youth. He feels it is up to parents to engender in their children the fact that every human being has something to offer, regardless of where one comes from.

Now battling liver cancer, Urzua still finds the time to keep up with students. Even though it has caused him to slow down, he does not resent it nor the turn his life has taken. Initially he did think it was unfair, until he saw those receiving treatment along with him who were younger and had yet to live their lives. Hence, he has come to accept, along with his family, whatever may come along. Unlike most people, he has lived a full life, refusing to be silenced, and has made an indelible impression upon many. He is angry about those things that can be changed, not about those things, like cancer, that have as yet proven to be impervious.
