There are two types of stained glass windows in the church located at 26 E Gutierrez St, Santa Barbara. In my professional opinion the 8 large windows on the sides of the building (4 on each side) appear to be the original stained glass that was installed in the 1920's. The windows in the front of the building (one large on the 2nd story, 3 rectangular at the front steps, and one round in the tower) and a single, small, round window on the side of the tower facing west are all newer, likely from the 1950's. The original windows are made with an opaque glass, commonly used for Baptist churches of that time period. The newer windows were created with much brighter colors and varying textures of glass. The lead style of the windows on the front of the building also shows they were not made at the same time, but rather added later.
