The purpose of this letter is to request the removal of a "setback" tree on the property located at 2920 Hermosa Rd. My wife and I recently purchased the house with the plan of using the driveway for access to the garage so that my wife can park our van there. This will allow her to unload our two young sons off of the street. Unfortunately, the tree has taken over such a large portion of the driveway entrance that we fear she will damage the van while attempting to enter and exit.

Additionally, our house is surrounded by properties that are set up to rent to multiple families and finding street parking is always extremely difficult. The removal of the tree would allow me to park my car in the driveway as well and alleviate some of the street crowding. The location of the tree changes what is actually a large driveway into one that is barely usable.

Our family is very fond of trees and we spent thousands of dollars on our previous property planting a mature Magnolia, Camphor and Strawberry tree. We would be more than happy to plant a mature Magnolia tree in the front yard of this property as well. However, we would like to locate it in the front yard rather than the driveway.
