

**CITY OF SANTA BARBARA
PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT**

Summary of Council Actions

March 27, 2018 to April 17, 2018

1. On March 27, 2018, Council:
 - a. Increased revenues and appropriations by \$53,000 in the Fiscal Year 2018 Parks and Recreation Department Capital Fund for a grant from the Wood-Claeysens Foundation for new playground equipment; and
 - b. Awarded a contract to Civic Construction Associates, Inc., in their low bid amount of \$253,700 for construction of the New Playground and Patio at the Municipal Tennis Courts; and authorized the Parks and Recreation Director to execute the contract and approve expenditures up to \$25,370 to cover any cost increases that may result from contract change orders for unanticipated work.
2. On April 10, 2017, Council authorized the Parks and Recreation Director to execute a professional services agreement with SWA Group in the amount of \$205,715 to prepare conceptual plans and construction documents for the Bohnett Park Renovation Project, and approved expenditures up to \$20,571 to cover any cost increase that may result from necessary changes in the scope of work.
3. On April 10, 2017, Council authorized the Parks and Recreation Director to execute a professional services agreement with SWA Group in the amount of \$138,400 to prepare preliminary design plans for the West Beach Splash Playground, and approved expenditures of up to \$13,840 to cover any cost increase that may result from necessary changes in the scope of work.
4. On April 10, 2017, Council authorized the Parks and Recreation Director to execute a personal services agreement with Jon Lee, an individual, for the provision of 2018 Youth Beach Volleyball Camps, with compensation equal to 65% of the total basic fees collected for the camp and the total compensation estimated at \$100,000 based on the projected number of camp participants.
5. On April 10, 2017, Council authorized the Parks and Recreation Director to execute a personal services agreement with NAYA DBA Kidz Love Soccer, a California Corporation, for the provision of 2018 Youth Soccer Programs, with compensation equal to 65% of the total basic fees collected for the camp and the total compensation estimated at \$40,000 based on the projected number of camp participants
