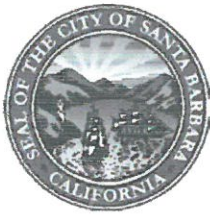

Request to remove tree:

We would like to remove a large Deador Pine that is in our front yard and that is close to the house and presents a significant fire risk, is getting progressively drier throughout the drought, and has caused significant root infiltration into our plumbing drainage to the sewer system on the Anacapa side of our house. There is no new development or redevelopment planned. To our knowledge the tree has no designated Specimen or Historic status.

We do not wish to replace the tree since it has grown so large that it is masking some beautiful large Bird of Paradise plants that frame the house, and do not want to increase our water usage.
