

**CITY OF SANTA BARBARA
PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT**

Summary of Council Actions

December 17 through January 14, 2020

1. On December 17, 2020, Council:
 - A. Introduced and subsequently adopted, by reading of title only, an Ordinance of the Council of the City of Santa Barbara Approving and Authorizing the Parks and Recreation Director to Execute an Amended and Restated Lease for a Portion of the Cabrillo Pavilion; and
 - B. Increased revenues and appropriations within the Fiscal Year 2020 Capital Outlay Fund, Cabrillo Pavilion Capital Account by \$56,148.
2. On January 7, 2020, Council:
 - A. Authorized the Parks and Recreation Director to execute a Caretaker Rental Agreement for Hilda McIntyre Ray Park with Spencer Frasher, commencing February 1, 2020, through January 31, 2021;
 - B. Authorized the Parks and Recreation Director to execute a Caretaker Rental Agreement for Franceschi Park with Luis Quesada, commencing February 1, 2020, through January 31, 2021; and
 - C. Authorized the Parks and Recreation Director to execute a Caretaker Rental Agreement for Skofield Park with Christopher Clark, commencing February 1, 2020 through January 31, 2021.
3. On January 7, 2020, Council increased appropriations and estimated revenues by \$87,444 in the Parks and Recreation Department Fiscal Year 2020 Miscellaneous Grants Fund for the maintenance of Parma Park, funded from a contribution from the Parma Park Trust.
4. On January 14, 2020, Council authorized the Parks and Recreation Director to enter into a professional services agreement with Kruger Bensen Ziemer Architects, Inc. (KBZ) in the amount of \$94,000 to provide continued architectural services for the Cabrillo Pavilion and Bathhouse (Cabrillo Pavilion) Renovation Project.
5. On January 14, 2020, Council authorized the Parks and Recreation Director to execute a First Amendment to Professional Services Agreement No. 26,000 with Bildsten Architecture and Planning, Inc. in the amount of \$30,650 for final design, construction documents, and bid support services for the Louise Lowry Davis Center Renovation Project.
