SUBJECT: Street Tree Designation for the Olive Mill Roundabout Project

The Olive Mill Road Roundabout Project (Project) involves the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Coast Village Road, Olive Mill Road, Jameson Lane, the U.S. Highway 101 southbound on-ramp, and the U.S. Highway 101 northbound off-ramp. The proposed work will include construction of a 22-foot wide roundabout with a central pedestrian refuge island, installation of curb and gutter in the City's right of way along Coast Village Road west of Olive Mill Road, construction of new sidewalk, construction of new pavement, drainage improvements, installation of street lighting, tree removal and replacement, and installation landscaping.

Three potential street trees are proposed as part of this Project, shown in the Landscape Plan (Attachment A). The three trees proposed to be planted within the center of the roundabout are *Olea europaea* (Olive Trees). Although the majority of the roundabout will be constructed within the County's jurisdiction, one tree may actually end up within the City's Right of Way. Staff is requesting the Street Tree Advisory Committee to consider the designation of the Olive Tree as a street tree for Olive Mill Road.

The Project received favorable comments from the Architectural Board of Review (ABR) on November 18, 2019. The Project is scheduled for review at the Planning Commission in March of 2020. The City anticipates approval for the Project design from the ABR in late spring of 2020.
