A. Conditionally approve the following street tree removal request:

1. Intersection of Olive Mill Rd., Coast Village Rd., N. Jameson Ln., and US 101 – (1) *Corymbia citriodora*, Lemon Scented Gum, and (4) *Washingtonia robusta*, Mexican Fan Palm – Laura Yanez, Public Works Engineering

The Commission received the report, their questions were answered, and the following action was taken:

1. 1308 E. Cota St. – (2) *Albizia julibrissin*, Silk Tree – Karen Christman, Arbor Services, Inc.

Commissioner Longstreet / Martinez Cohen to concur with the Street Tree Advisory Committee recommendation and deny the removal of the western Silk Tree and approve removal and replacement of the eastern tree with a Coast Live Oak by City staff, who will also prune the western tree.

1. 1171 Crestline Dr. – (2) *Maytenus boaria*, Mayten Tree – Anthony R. Perez

The Commission received the report, their questions were answered, and the following action was taken:

Commissioner Longstreet / McGill to concur with the Street Tree Advisory Committee recommendation and approve the removals, as pursuant to SBMC 15.24.090, the principles of good forest management will best be

served and the character of the immediate neighborhood would not be materially affected by the removals.

F. Conditionally approve the following setback tree removal request:

1. 3445-3449 Richland Dr. – (1) *Juniperus chinensis* ‘*Torulosa*,’ Hollywood Juniper, and (3) *Juniper sp.*, Juniper sp. – Richard Mason, Kitson Landscape Management

The Commission received the report, listened to testimony, their questions were answered, and the following action was taken:

Commissioner Longstreet / McGill to refer the item back to the Street Tree Advisory Committee to revisit the location of replacement trees.

G. Partially and conditionally approve the following setback tree removal requests:

1. 1212 Punta Gorda St. – (1) *Aesculus hippocastanum*, Common Horsechestnut, (1) *Ficus benjamina*, Weeping Fig, and (1) *Ceiba speciosa*, Floss Silk Tree – Ricardo Frustockl

The Commission received the report, their questions were answered, and the following action was taken:

Motion:

Commissioner Longstreet / Perry to concur with the Street Tree Advisory Committee recommendation and approve the removals of the Common Horsechestnut and Weeping Fig on the condition a replacement 15 gallon Coast Live Oak be planted, as pursuant to SBMC 15.24.090, the principles of good forest management will best be served and a reasonable development of the property requires their removal, and deny removal of the Floss Silk Tree, as no findings for its removal were identified.

2. 3069 Calle Mariposa – (1) *Pyrus kawakamii*, Evergreen Pear, and (1) *Citrus sinensis*, Orange – Greg Mohr and Wendy Wittl

The Commission received the report, their questions were answered, and the following action was taken:

Commissioner Clark / Martinez Cohen to concur with the Street Tree Advisory Committee recommendation and approve removal of the Orange on the condition a replacement fruit tree be planted as proposed on the application, as pursuant to SBMC 15.24.090, the principles of good forest management will best be served by its removal, and deny removal of the Evergreen Pear, as no findings for its removal were identified.
