### **AIRLINE TERMINAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT**

Review and recommendations to City Council on the Airline Terminal Project Program Criteria Document.

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Commission has held the required public hearing on the above application, and the Applicant was present.

**WHEREAS**, no one appeared to speak in favor of or in opposition to the application, and the following exhibits were presented for the record:

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Planning Commission:

Recommends that the City Council approve the Airline Terminal Project Criteria Document, with amendments to include:

1. An outline of the existing terminal layout on the proposed site plan.
2. Increased landscaping in the rental parking lot and the remainder of the parking lots.
3. Continued work on hiding the rental parking lot as seen from the observation deck.
4. Providing an area for children's activities, such as a Children's Museum.
5. Extending the length of the sidewalks to the limits of the construction area.
6. Providing a parkway between the sidewalk and the roadway wherever feasible.
