Members may be residents of the City or adjoining unincorporated areas of Santa Barbara County. Members shall demonstrate knowledge and expertise in specialty areas governed by the construction and fire codes of the City.

Member must be a resident of the City.	
Civil Service Commission	1
Member must be Qualified Elector* of the City. Member may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government, and for one year after ceasing to be a member, shall not be eligible for any salaried office or employment with the City.	
Community Development and Human Services Committee	2
Members must be residents or employees of the following designated organizations, but need not be Qualified Electors* of the City. Member must represent the Lower Westside Neighborhood and one member must represent the Downtown Neighborhood.	
Community Events and Festivals Committee.....	0
County of Santa Barbara, Library Advisory Committee	1
Member must be a qualified Elector* of the City.	
Creeks Advisory Committee.....	0
Downtown Parking Committee.....	0
Fire and Police Commission	0
Fire and Police Pension Commission.....	2
One member must be an active or retired police officer who is a member of the Fire and Police Pension System, who need not be a resident or Qualified Elector* of the City. One member must be a Qualified Elector* of the City and a retired Firefighter.

Members must be Qualified Electors* of the City.	
Historic Landmarks Commission.....	2
Members must demonstrate interest in and knowledge of the history and architecture of the City. Members may be Qualified Electors* of the City or County of Santa Barbara. One member must be a Licensed Architect and one member must represent the position of Professional Architectural Historian.	
Housing Authority Commission	2
Two members must be City residents and will represent the public at large.	
Library Board	0
Living Wage Advisory Committee	4
Members may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government. Members must represent one of the following specified categories: Two Nominees of a Local Living Wage Advocacy Organization, Nominee of the Santa Barbara Chamber of Commerce or Santa Barbara Downtown Organization; and Employee of Local Non-Profit Entity.	
Measure P Committee	5
One member of each of the following categories: Criminal Defense Attorney; Drug Abuse Treatment & Prevention Counselor; Resident of the City and two positions for Civil Liberties Advocates.	
Metropolitan Transit District	2
Members must be residents within the Santa Barbara Metropolitan Transit District and must have resided within the District at least 1 year immediately prior to appointment. Members may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government.	
Mosquito and Vector Management District Board	0
Neighborhood Advisory Council.....	4
Members must be residents of the City but need not be Qualified Electors*. One member must be of each of the following categories: West Downtown Neighborhood, Eastside Neighborhood and two members may represent the Public at Large. <i>Note: The Council may appoint youth members, ages 16 or 17; priority may be given to youth from the specified neighborhoods.</i>	
Parks and Recreation Commission	1
Member must be a Qualified Elector* of the City.

Rental Housing Mediation Board	4
<p>Members must be residents of the City or the County* of Santa Barbara and represent the following categories: Tenant; Homeowner; and two positions for Landlords. The majority of members must be residents of the City of Santa Barbara. Non-City residents must reside in a jurisdiction which contracts with the Rental Housing Mediation Program for services. Tenants must be renting/leasing a dwelling, and have no ownership of residential properties.</p>	
Santa Barbara Youth Council.....	12
<p>Members must be between the ages of 13 – 19 years and may be from the City or County. Two members must be from a Local Private High School; Two members from Dos Pueblos High School; Three members from Santa Barbara High School; Two members from San Marco High School; Two members from Local Alternative, Community, or Continuation High School; and One Member at Large.</p> <p><i>Note: Of the 15 members, 8 must be residents of the City of Santa Barbara.</i></p>

Single Family Design Board.....	3
<p>Member must reside within the County of Santa Barbara. One member must possess professional qualifications in fields related to architecture, including, but not limited to building design, structural engineering, industrial design, or landscape contracting. One member may represent the Public at Large. One member must be a Licensed Landscape Architect.</p>
