



Cabrillo Boulevard Bridge Replacement

Project Update: December 2015

The horizontal bridge supports have been delivered and installed via crane on the mountain-side of the new Cabrillo Boulevard Bridge.

Upcoming Work:

Throughout December, work on the Cabrillo Boulevard Bridge will focus on constructing the bridge deck over the new girders, then the barrier rail and sidewalk improvements. Depending on weather, roadway improvements may begin as well.

On the beach side of the project, the temporary bridge will be delivered and installed with two cranes on the morning of December 3rd. During the installation, Cabrillo Boulevard will be closed between State and Anacapa Streets between 6:00 am and 10:00 am. Detours will be signed on site. Westbound vehicles will be able to use Anacapa, Yanonali, and State Streets during the detour. Eastbound vehicles will use Castillo, Montecito, and Anacapa Streets.

Utility relocations will begin to temporarily move utilities from the Cabrillo Boulevard Bridge to the temporary pedestrian bridge to prepare for Stage 3 of construction when the beach-side of the bridge will be removed and rebuilt. The pedestrian bridge will also maintain the heavily used multipurpose beach-way when the sidewalk on the beach-side of Cabrillo Boulevard and some parkway paths will be closed to enable construction of the new Cabrillo Boulevard Bridge. The pedestrian bridge was prefabricated due to its temporary nature and is scheduled to be removed at the completion of the project.

In observance of Christmas and New Year's holidays, crews will not work on December 25th and January 1st.

**Closures:**

Throughout Stage 2, the mountain side of Cabrillo Boulevard will remain closed near the bridge. One lane in each direction remains open on Cabrillo Boulevard during daytime construction for vehicular use. Helena Avenue is closed to vehicles at Cabrillo Boulevard, but access will remain for pedestrians, bikes, and segways.

To accommodate the work area, the left turn lane from westbound Cabrillo Boulevard to Stearns Wharf is closed. Motorists can enter Stearns Wharf from State Street and eastbound Cabrillo Boulevard. Detour signs are in place to highlight access around the closures.

Fall 2014 - 2016:

The Cabrillo Boulevard Bridge Replacement Project includes a new bridge, enhanced Mission Creek banks, and improved pedestrian areas. Cabrillo Boulevard, surrounding businesses, parks, Stearns Wharf, and the Arts and Crafts Show will remain open throughout construction.
