Access Advisory Committee	1
Members must be residents of the City, or full-time employees of an entity doing business within the City, who demonstrates interest, experience, and commitment to issues pertaining to disability and access. One member from the Architectural, Engineering, or Building Communities.	
Airport Commission	1
Member may be a qualified elector* of the City or a resident of the County.	
Architectural Board of Review.....	1
Member need not be a qualified elector* of the City at the time of appointment so long as they are qualified electors of Santa Barbara County and remains so qualified during their terms on the Board. Member may be a licensed architect, possess professional experience in related fields, including, but not limited to landscape architecture, building design, structural engineering or industrial design, or may represent the public at large.	
Central Coast Commission for Senior Citizens	1
Member must be a resident of the City.	
Citizens' Oversight Committee.....	7
Five members must be qualified electors* of the City; the remaining two members may be electors not living in the City. One member must be a representative of the business community and one must be a representative of the hospitality community.	
Civil Service Commission	1
Member must be a qualified elector* of the City. May not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government, and for one year after ceasing to be a member, shall not be eligible for any salaried office or employment with the City.	
Community Development and Human Services Committee.....	5
Members must be residents or employees of the designated organizations, but need not be qualified electors* of the City. One representative from each of the following specified categories or organizations: Business Community/Economic Development; Disabled Community; Eastside Neighborhood; Homeless-related Services Organization; Oak Park Neighborhood.	
Downtown Parking Committee	1
Members shall demonstrate an interest in and knowledge of downtown parking issues: Member may be a resident of the City or the County.	
Historic Landmarks Commission	1
Members must demonstrate an interest and knowledge of the history and architecture of the City. Member may be a qualified elector of the City or the County. Member may represent the public at large.	

* Resident of the City of Santa Barbara and a U.S. citizen age 18 or older.

Living Wage Advisory Committee.....	2
One member nominated by a local Santa Barbara area living wage advocacy organization; and one member nominated by either the Santa Barbara Chamber of Commerce or Santa Barbara Downtown Organization.	
Measure P Committee.....	7
Appointees may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government. Members must represent the following categories: Two residents of the City; one criminal defense attorney; one civil liberties advocate; one medical marijuana patient; one medical professional; and one drug abuse, treatment and prevention counselor.	
Neighborhood Advisory Council.....	3
Members must be residents of the following neighborhoods: Westside; Lower Westside; West Downtown; Eastside; Lower Eastside; and Laguna. The City Council may, but is not required to, appoint up to three (3) youth that are the ages of 16 or 17. Priority may be given to youth from the six (6) specified neighborhoods.	
Rental Housing Mediation Board.....	1
Member must be a Tenant who rents or leases his or her residence and may not own residential property. Member may be a non-City resident. Non-City residents must reside in a jurisdiction which contracts with the Rental Housing Mediation Program for services.	
Santa Barbara Youth Council.....	4
Members must be between the ages of 13 – 19 years old. Members must be residents of the City. One member representing San Marcos High School; and two members from local alternative, community, or continuation high schools.	
Sign Committee.....	2
Members must be residents of the City who represent the public at large.	
Sister Cities Board.....	1
Members must be residents of the City. One member may be a resident of the County.	
Water Commission.....	1
Members must be qualified electors* of the City.
