Central Coast Commission for Senior Citizens .....1 Member must be a resident of the City.	1
Citizens' Oversight Committee .....1 Member may be a non- City resident who represents the business community.	1
Civil Service Commission .....1 Member must be a qualified elector* of the City. Members may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government, and for one year after ceasing to be a member, shall not be eligible for any salaried office or employment with the City.	1
Community Development and Human Services Committee .....5 Members must be residents or employees of the designated organizations, but need not be qualified electors* of the City. One representative from each of the following specified categories or organizations: Disabled Community; Homeless-related Services Organization; Latino Community; Oak Park Neighborhood; Westside/Lower Westside Neighborhood.	5
Community Events and Festivals Committee .....1 Appointees may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government. Member must represent the public at large.	1
County of Santa Barbara Library Advisory Committee .....1 Member must be a resident of the City of Santa Barbara.	1
Creeks Advisory Committee.....1 Member may be a non-City resident who represents the hotel/lodging industry.	1
Housing Authority Commission .....1 Member may be a non-City resident who represents the public at large.	1
Living Wage Advisory Committee .....3 One member who is an owner/manager of a business operating within the City; one member nominated by either the Santa Barbara Chamber of Commerce or Santa Barbara Downtown Organization; and one member who is an owner/manager of a service contractor subject to the City's Living Wage ordinance. Appointees may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government.	3
Measure P Committee.....7 Appointees may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government. Members must represent the following categories: Two residents of the City; one criminal defense attorney; one civil liberties advocate; one medical marijuana patient; one medical professional; and one drug abuse, treatment and prevention counselor.	7

Mosquito and Vector Management District Board .....	1
Member must be a resident of the City who is registered to vote in the City of Santa Barbara, or a member of the City Council.	
Neighborhood Advisory Council .....	2
Members must be residents of the following neighborhoods: Westside, West Downtown, Eastside, Lower Eastside, and Laguna; or represent the public at large. The City Council may, but is not required to, appoint up to three (3) youth that are the ages of 16 or 17. Priority may be given to youth from the six (6) specified neighborhoods.	
Parks and Recreation Commission .....	1
One youth intern, who is not a member of the Commission, shall be a high school student volunteer who resides within the Santa Barbara High School District or attends other high schools within the City limits and is nominated by the principal of the student's high school. The student shall be either in their junior or senior year of high school and shall be and remain a student in good standing as is determined by the high school. A student that graduates shall not serve for more than three (3) months following graduation.	
Rental Housing Mediation Board .....	1
Members must meet the definition of the following category: member must be a landlord who is a City or non-City resident and owns or manages residential properties for consideration or compensation, whether single or multiple units. Non-City residents must reside in a jurisdiction which contracts with the Rental Housing Mediation Program for services.	
Santa Barbara Youth Council .....	10
Members must be between the ages of 13 – 19 years old. Majority of members must be residents of the City. Other members may be residents of the County. Members must be students from the following schools: SBUSD high schools (San Marcos HS, Santa Barbara HS, and Dos Pueblos HS); local private high school; and one member representing the public at large.	
Single Family Design Board .....	2
Members must be residents of the County of Santa Barbara. One member must be a licensed architect, and another member must possess professional qualifications in fields related to architecture, including, but not limited to, building design, structural design, structural engineering, industrial design, or landscape contracting.	
Transportation and Circulation Committee .....	1
Member may be qualified electors* of the City or County.
