<u>ADVISORY GROUP</u>	<u>NUMBER OF VACANCIES</u>
Access Advisory Committee	2
Members must be residents of the City, or full-time employees of an entity doing business within the City, who demonstrate interest, experience, and commitment to issues pertaining to disability and access. Member must be from the Architectural, Engineering, or Building Communities; or must represent the Public at Large.	
Airport Commission	3
Members may be a qualified electors* of the City or a resident of the County.	
Architectural Board of Review	2
Members need not be qualified electors* of the City at the time of appointment so long as they are qualified electors of Santa Barbara County and remains so qualified during their terms on the Board. One member must be a licensed architect; the other member shall possess professional experience in related fields, including but not limited to landscape architecture, building design, structural engineering, or industrial design, or may represent the public at large.	
Building and Fire Code Board of Appeals	1
Member must be a resident of the City or of the adjoining unincorporated area of Santa Barbara County; member must also demonstrate knowledge and expertise in specialty areas governed by the construction and fire codes of the City. Members may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government.	
Central Coast Commission for Senior Citizens	1
Member must be a resident of the City.	
Civil Service Commission	2
Members must be qualified electors* of the City. Members may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government, and for one year after ceasing to be a member, shall not be eligible for any salaried office or employment with the City.	
Community Development and Human Services Committee	6
Members must be residents or employees of the designated organizations, but need not be qualified electors* of the City. One representative from each of the following specified categories or organizations: Disabled Community; Eastside Neighborhood; Homeless-related Services Organization; Latino Community; Oak Park Neighborhood; Westside/Lower Westside Neighborhood.	
Community Events and Festivals Committee	3
Appointees may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government. Members must represent the following categories: Public at Large; Cultural Arts.	

* Resident of the City of Santa Barbara who is a U.S. citizen age 18 or older.

Creeks Advisory Committee	3
Members must be residents of the City or County of Santa Barbara and have some experience in ocean use, business, and environmental/land use issues and provide community-at-large representation.	
Fire and Police Commission	2
Members must be qualified electors* of the City.	
Harbor Commission	1
Member must be a qualified elector* of the City.	
Historic Landmarks Commission	4
Members must demonstrate an interest and knowledge of the history and architecture of the City. Members may be qualified electors* of the City or the County. Members may represent the public at large, or may be Licensed Architects.	
Library Board	1
Member must be a qualified elector* of the City.	
Living Wage Advisory Committee	3
One member nominated by a local Santa Barbara area living wage advocacy organization; one member nominated by either the Santa Barbara Chamber of Commerce or Santa Barbara Downtown Organization; and one member who is an owner/manager of a business within the City. Appointees may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government.	
Measure P Committee.....	7
Appointees may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government. Members must represent the following categories: Two residents of the City; one criminal defense attorney; one civil liberties advocate; one medical marijuana patient; one medical professional; and one drug abuse, treatment and prevention counselor.	
Mosquito and Vector Management District Board	1
Member must be a resident of the City who is registered to vote in the City of Santa Barbara, or a member of the City Council.	
Neighborhood Advisory Council	4
Members must be residents of the following neighborhoods: Westside; Lower Westside; West Downtown. Two members must represent the public at large. The City Council may, but is not required to, appoint up to three (3) youth that are the ages of 16 or 17. Priority may be given to youth from the six (6) specified neighborhoods.	
Parks and Recreation Commission	2
Must be qualified electors* of the City. One member of the Parks and Recreation Commission may be an individual of age 16 years or older who resides in the City, but is not a qualified elector. The City Council may, but is not required to, appoint a youth member to the Parks and Recreation Commission.	
Planning Commission	1
Member must be a qualified elector* of the City.	

* Resident of the City of Santa Barbara who is a U.S. citizen age 18 or older.

Rental Housing Mediation Board	7
<p>Members must meet the definition of the following categories: three members must be Tenants who rent or lease his or her residence and may not own residential property; one member must be a homeowner must own his or her residence and may not own any other residential property; three members must be landlords that must own or manage residential properties for consideration or compensation, whether single or multiple units. Non-City residents must reside in a jurisdiction which contracts with the Rental Housing Mediation Program for services.</p>	
Santa Barbara Youth Council	3
<p>Members must be between the ages of 13 – 19 years old. Majority of members must be residents of the City. Other members may be residents of the County. Members must be from local alternative, community, or continuation high schools; or attend a private high school.</p>	
Sign Committee	2
<p>Members must be qualified electors* of the City who represent the public at large.</p>	
Sister Cities Board	1
<p>Members may be either residents of the City or adjoining areas of Santa Barbara County.</p>	
Transportation and Circulation Committee	4
<p>Members may be qualified electors* of the City or County.</p>
