

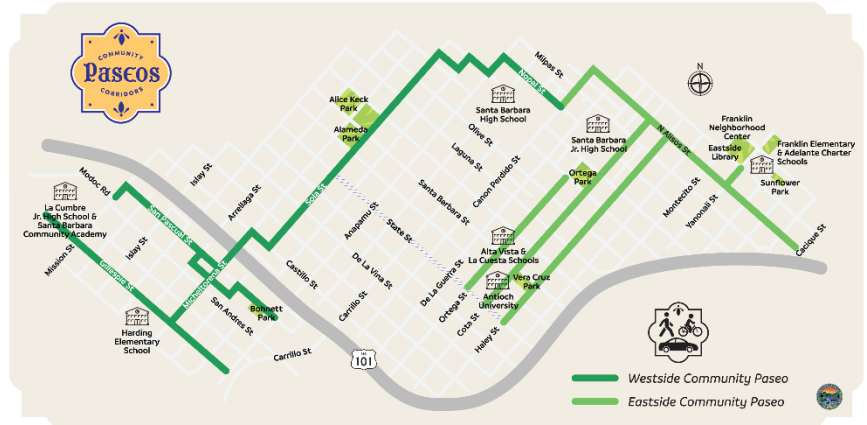


PROJECT TITLE:

Westside Community Paseos

WHY THIS PROJECT?:

The Westside neighborhood lacks bike facilities and safe crossings of U.S. Highway 101 to the Downtown corridor. A lack of alternatives to biking along busy corridors, inadequate crossings and missing bike route connections all contribute to an uneasy experience for cyclists and pedestrians. The Westside Community Paseos will establish safe and efficient connections from the Westside to the Downtown area, the Eastside, schools, and parks.



PROJECT BENEFITS:

Improving walking and biking facilities will provide more alternatives to travel around town, whether for work, play, school, or daily outings. The project will create safe and efficient bike routes for cyclists who currently use the busy commercial roadways on Micheltorena and San Andres Streets. With a focus on low vehicular-volume streets, the improvements will also provide a safe route to four local schools, encouraging students to bike or walk. Key features will include improved crosswalks, access ramps, improved signage, high visibility bike lanes, traffic signals, traffic diverter medians, landscaped peninsulas, and new street lighting.

Design Schedule: summer 2019 - winter 2022

Construction Schedule: summer 2022 – winter 2023

Total Project Costs: \$4.5 million
