DISCUSSION POINTS –

As our Department's explorer post gains momentum, we as a department need to make sure we are ready to meet their educational needs, as well as provide a safe environment for learning. Youth safety is the No. 1 concern of Learning for Life. Effective June 1, 2010: Youth Protection Training is required for all volunteers in curriculum based Learning for Life, including worksite based Exploring. Youth Protection Training must be taken every two years and prior to beginning curriculum based programs & meetings with youth. Because there is a unique difference between Learning for Life programs in worksite based Exploring and in the curriculum based programs, we have established tailored training procedures. The Learning for Life's Youth Protection Training will cover:

- ✓ Policies
- ✓ Guidelines
- ✓ Adolescent transition
- It is required that all department members listed below create a new account and complete the certified Youth Protection Training online.
 - Lieutenants
 - Sergeants
 - Officers
 - Dispatchers
 - Reserve Officers

This training is mandatory and should be completed no later than <u>Monday April 1, 2013</u>. Upon successfully completing the brief online training, you are to immediately print your certificate and inner-office mail it to Training Attn: Sadie

1. Log on to <u>http://exploring.learningforlife.org/</u> select resources, then Youth Protection Training



2. You will need to create an account. Once you have created your account check your email, there will be a link to set your password. Then you can log in to the Real-Worl Career Experiences Exploring site. Select My Training at the top, then scroll down and select youth protection training, click "take course"
